






Property Description


The building dates back to the 1930s and was designed by Guy Morgan. Perhaps its most notable feature is the rooftop canopy, which mimics the deck of a larger cruise ship. Still striking today too. The building consists of 64 flats, all of which were initially rented out. Private sales only started in the 1970s, with some apartments still on long-term rental contracts, and of course this one available now to rent.

You get over 800 sq. ft. of accommodation within and some wonderful large windows to boost the light. That space includes two double bedrooms, a modern kitchen, lounge and a bathroom with seperate shower cubicle!

The property sits within well maintained communal grounds and gardens, including a 25m open air swimming pool, an immaculate tennis court, a bike store and there is also off-street parking **aures**
