Undoubtedly the heart of the home is the magnificent full-width dining kitchen, which exudes quality and contemporary style. 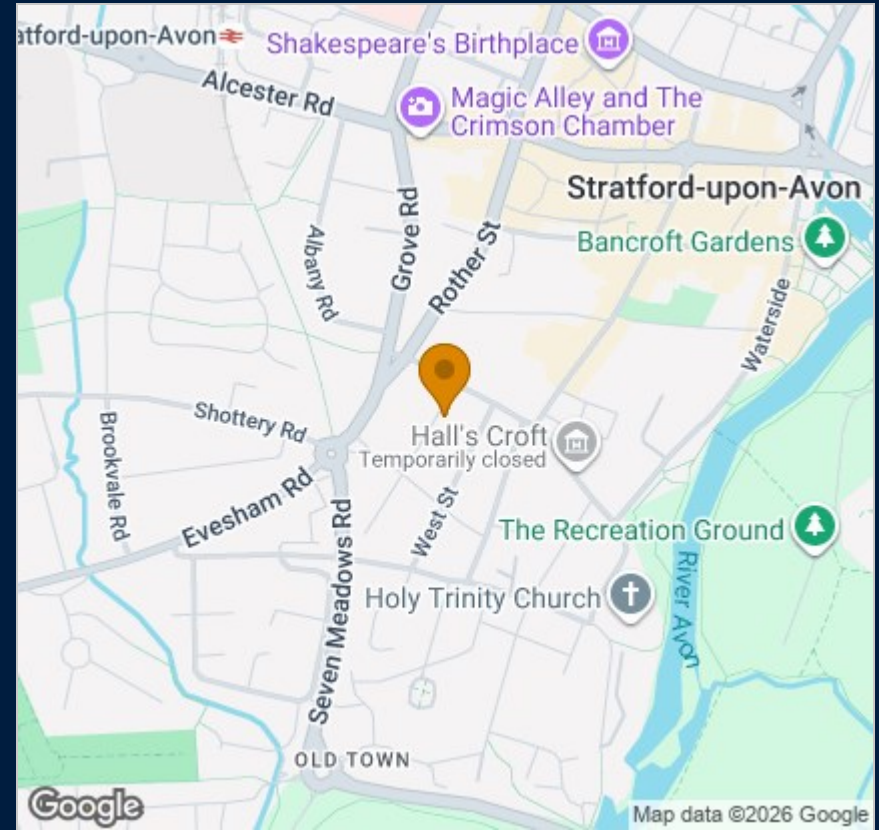

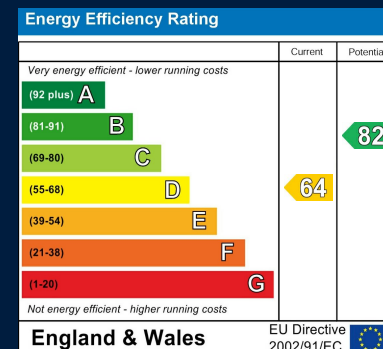
Floor Plan
