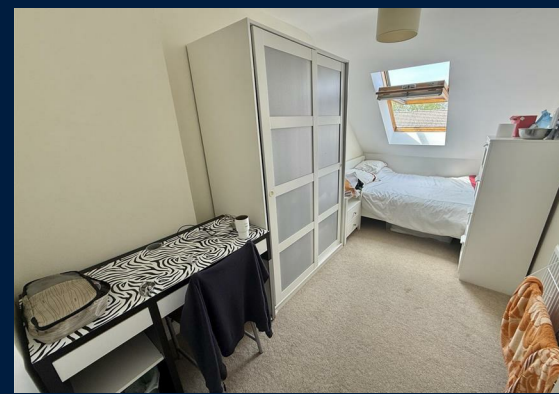

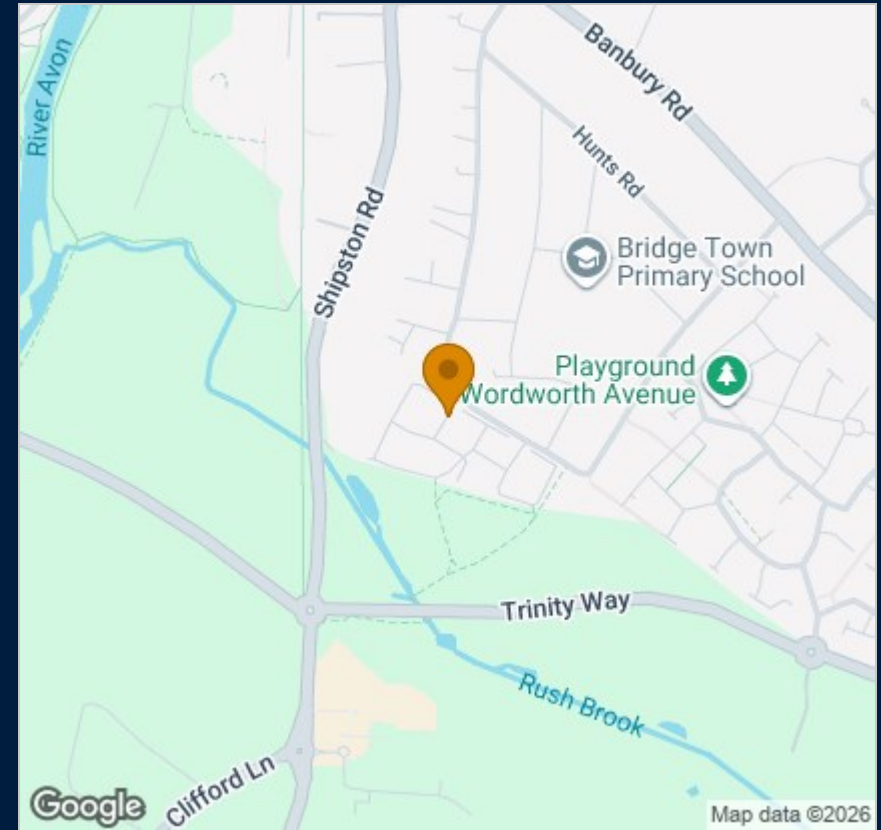

Map



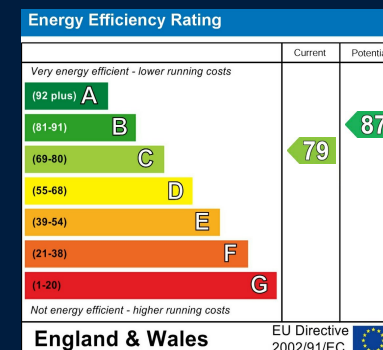
